**Subject:** FW: Information on Parker-Davis Project Remarketing

Mr. Brian Young,

We are appreciative of the 2MW proposed allocation to Navy and Marine Corps bases spread across the SCE and SDG&E service territories in California. The load requirement of these bases combined is 200MW. Compared to what our military bases are paying for market power, 2MW will be a significant savings to the military and the taxpayers. These bases do not currently have hydropower allocation. Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Southwest (NAVFAC Southwest) is the contracting agency for these bases/activities. We procure the electric commodity and the transmission and distribution (T&D) for them under the California direct access authority.

NAVFAC Southwest intends to equally distribute the 2MW allocation to the eleven (11) Marine Corps and Navy Bases who have submitted the request for allocation. It is our interpretation that this is in line with Western's intent to widely disseminate use of the allocated hydro power. Therefore as an administrative change we are requesting that note (3) in the "Proposed Allocations Capacity in Megawatts (MW)" table, advertised in the Federal Register, be changed to reflect the above.
