Re: SRP's Comments About the Proposed 2025 Salt Lake City Area Integrated Projects (SLCA/IP) General Power Marketing Criteria/Plan (Proposed 2025 CRSP Marketing Plan, FRN dated 12-16-2015, 80 FR 78222 and FRN dated March 28, 2016, 81 FR 17163)

The Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District (SRP) appreciates the opportunity to participate in and comment on the Proposed 2025 CRSP Marketing Plan and offers the following comments for WAPA's review and consideration.

- SRP supports the continued use of the general contract form with existing customers.
- Additionally, SRP is supportive of making as few changes as possible to the contract that has worked well for a number of years.
- SRP supports the forty (40) year contract term.
- SRP does not support the proposed concept of a reopener, or reevaluation, at a 20 year interval during the contract period. Resource certainty has value.
- SRP supports the continuation of the existing Marketing Area as referenced in FRN 80 FR 78222.
- SRP supports using the SLCA/IP definition currently implemented for the Winter Season (October-March) and Summer Season (April – September) in the proposed Marketing Plan.
- SRP supports WAPA having the right to adjust the Contract Rate of Delivery (CROD) and associated energy on five (5) years written notice, provided WAPA collaborates and meets with Preference Customers prior to giving any such notice. SRP believes that collaboration with Preference Customers may provide an opportunity for exploring other viable options before simply reducing the CROD.

- Should an increase in resources occur during the marketing plan, any increase should be allocated pro-rata to existing customers in the same manner as a decrease in CROD would occur (if a decrease was to occur).
- SRP supports the extension of each existing customer's CROD for the contract term.
- SRP supports the retention of Customer Displacement Power and WAPA Replacement Power (CDP/WRP) at the customer's option.
- SRP supports WAPA's sale of unused firm transmission on a non-firm basis when that capacity is not used to deliver customer allocations or customer CDP/WRP and that any revenue generated from such sales be applied to reduce the composite rate set for CRSP customers.
- SRP supports the continued use of the current GPCP dated September 1, 2007 for the proposed contract.
- SRP believes that existing customers should not need to re-submit customer profile data.
- SRP supports WAPA's conclusion that sufficient resources do not exist for the creation of a new resource pool.

SRP supports WAPA taking steps to finalize the 2025 Marketing Plan as reported in the March 28, 2016 FRN by providing "additional opportunities to consult with WAPA." As stated, SRP supports contract extensions to existing Firm Electric Service Contracts and will support WAPA in achieving this by the end of the current fiscal year.
