
These comments are submitted on behalf of Roosevelt Water Conservation District (“RWCD”) regarding the Salt Lake City Area Integrated Projects and Colorado River Storage Project 2025 General Power Marketing Criteria (the “Proposed 2025 Marketing Criteria”) published December 16, 2015, in the *Federal Register* at 80 Fed. Reg. 78222. RWCD is an existing SLCA/IP long-term firm power customer.

Based upon our reading of the Proposed 2025 Marketing Criteria and my telephone conversation with Brent Osiek and Parker Wicks, we understand that under the Proposed 2025 Marketing Criteria, existing SLCA/IP long-term firm power customers will be offered amended and restated contracts that will extend the existing contracts at the existing contract rate of delivery commitments and associated energy. These existing customers will not be required to make application for such extension. The principles in the Proposed 2025 Marketing Criteria set forth as principles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 apply only to new customers applying for an allocation from the potential 2% resource pool.

If our understanding of the Proposed 2025 Marketing Criteria is correct, we are supportive of the proposal and the approach Western has suggested.
