This letter officially notifies Western Area Power Administration (WAPA) that for Fiscal Year 2019 Reclamation is not applying a credit to the commercial power customers' Central Valley Project (CVP) repayment obligations. Reclamation continues to evaluate the scope and extent of potential credits due to water and power contractors. Once determined, Reclamation will provide an update to the CVPIA technical team committee. This evaluation includes reviewing internal processes and documented procedures assessing CVPIA credits/offsets or repayment obligations as reflected in the Expenditures, Credits, and Offsets (ECO) Report.

We understand commercial power customers concerns and are working diligently to ensure a mutually beneficial and transparent process to evaluate CVPIA cost allocations. We are pleased that power customers and WAPA are engaged in this process.
