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MANAGEMENT SUMMARY

Wilton Wind IV, LLC (Wilton IV), a subsidiary of NextEra Energy Resources, LLC (NextEra), is proposing to construct and operate the Wilton IV Wind Energy Center (the Project), an approximately 99 megawatt (MW) wind energy facility located approximately 7 miles southeast of Wilton in Burleigh County, North Dakota. The Project includes the construction of up to 62 General Electric (GE) 1.6 or 1.7 megawatt (MW) xle turbines in Crofte and Ghylin Townships and associated service roads, electrical collection system, and substation located in Crofte, Ecklund, and Ghylin Townships. The Project substation will be located in the northeast quarter of Section 20 in Ecklund Township adjacent to existing substations that collect power from nearby operating wind energy projects. The substation will connect to the existing Central Electric Power Cooperative transmission line via a 230 kV overhead tie line that spans approximately 240 feet (ft) over 279th Avenue NE to the Central Electric Power Cooperative transmission line. Existing operations and maintenance facilities will be used to support the Project. The Project will interconnect to the Western Area Power Administration's (Western) transmission system at its existing Hilken Switching Station via the Central Electric Power Cooperative transmission line.

Western's action to execute an interconnection agreement for the proposed Project requires review under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). In compliance with the NHPA and NEPA, Western and the State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) are considering how the proposed Project may affect cultural resources that are listed in or are potentially eligible for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Project also requires a Certificate of Site Compatibility from the North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC); therefore, the Project is subject to review by the SHSND under the North Dakota Century Code 55-02-07.

The portion of the Project in Crofte Township was previously evaluated as part of the Baldwin Wind Energy Center, which included 37 alternate turbines in Crofte Township. These turbines were not constructed as part of the Baldwin Wind Energy Center and some of these locations are currently proposed to be constructed as part of this Project. The current Project layout includes 33 turbines and 2 alternative turbine sites located in Crofte Township. The remaining 29 turbines are proposed to be located in Ghylin Township.

Tetra Tech's literature review identified one architectural investigation for the Project area, The Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey for the Baldwin Wind Energy Center. The Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey for the Baldwin Wind Energy

Center was conducted in 2010 and included the area within 1 mile of the proposed Baldwin turbine layout in Crofte Township. The survey evaluated historic structures over 45 years old or older. This survey did not include the current Project area located within Ghylin Township. Tetra Tech recommended that none of the 77 properties documented during survey were potentially eligible to the NRHP and a finding of No Historic Properties Affected was concurred with by the SHSND. Ten of these properties are located within the APE for the current Project. Included in this group were two previously-documented architectural properties 32BL654 (abandoned schoolhouse) and 32BL655 (abandoned farmstead) which had been documented during the Class III inventory of the Baldwin Wind Energy Center. The two architectural properties are not considered eligible for inclusion in the NRHP. Property 32BL654 is located within the Wilton IV APE.

The Class II Reconnaissance Survey for the current Project, covering the area within one mile of the nearest turbine that was not previously surveyed for Baldwin, examined 15 above ground resources including 13 farmsteads, one cemetery, and one former radio station. In addition, two previously unsurveyed farmsteads in the western section of the APE (the portion formerly surveyed for the Baldwin project) were also documented during this survey effort. In total, 17 properties were examined. Documentary research determined that only twelve of these properties were 45 years old or older. These twelve properties have been documented using North Dakota Cultural Resources Survey (NDCRS) Architectural Site Forms, included in Appendix A. It is Tetra Tech's recommendation that these properties are not eligible for inclusion in the NRHP. With respect to potential effects of the proposed Project on architectural properties in the study area Tetra Tech recommends a determination of **No Historic Properties Affected**.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report presents the results of a Class II historical architecture reconnaissance survey undertaken for the proposed Wilton Wind IV Energy Center (the Project) located in Burleigh County, North Dakota, by Tetra Tech, Inc (Tetra Tech). The Project will interconnect to the Western Area Power Administration's (Western) transmission system at its existing Hilken Switching Station via the Central Electric Power Cooperative transmission line. Western's action to execute an interconnection agreement for the proposed Project requires review under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) and the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). In compliance with the NHPA and NEPA, Western and the State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) are considering how the proposed Project may affect cultural resources that are listed in or are potentially eligible for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Project also requires a Certificate of Site Compatibility from the North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC); therefore, the Project is subject to review by the SHSND under the North Dakota Century Code 55-02-07. The purpose of the survey was to identify and document all above ground cultural resources within the Project's Area of Potential Effects for Architecture (APE) style-dated as 45 years old or older in order to provide the State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) with recommendations about the potential eligibility of these properties to the NRHP, and to provide information to the SHSND about potential direct and indirect effects of the Project on NRHP-listed and NRHP-eligible properties.

1.1 Project Description

Wilton Wind IV, LLC, a subsidiary of NextEra Energy Resources, proposes to build the Wilton IV Wind Energy Center (the Project) in Burleigh County, North Dakota. The proposed Project would consist of up to 62 GE 1.6 or 1.7 MW wind turbine generators, with a total nameplate capacity of approximately 99 MW. The Project Area encompasses approximately 24.6 square miles (15,752 acres) southeast of Wilton, North Dakota, and approximately 12 miles north of Bismarck. The Project Area is located immediately adjacent to three existing wind energy projects. The Project would also include associated access roads, electrical collection lines, a substation, two meteorological towers, and a 240-foot 230-kV overhead tie line across 279th Avenue NE.

1.2 Project Location and Area of Potential Effects (APE)

The Project is located in northern Burleigh County, North Dakota, to the east of the towns of Baldwin and Wilton. It consists of two distinct turbine fields 6 to 11 miles apart occupying adjoining ridges but separated from one another by the West Branch of Apple Creek. The southwestern turbine field will occupy a portion of Crofte Township, while the northeastern field will be in Ghylin Township (Figure 1). In consultation with the SHSND, the APE has been defined as the area located within one mile of any turbine; the APE

covers 54 sections in five townships (Table 1). As the western portion of the APE was previously surveyed for the Baldwin Wind Energy Center (Sexton 2010), the survey area for the present study comprised only those areas not previously surveyed. The effect of excluding the Baldwin project section is that the survey area considered for this report was defined as only the area within one mile of those Project elements within Ghylin Township (Figure 2a). This resulted in the survey area being limited to areas of Ghylin, Rock Hill and Cromwell Townships. The present survey area is roughly bounded in the following way: on the north by 292nd Avenue NE, on the east by 184th Street NE, on the south by 240th Avenue NE, and on the west by 132nd Street NE. One property that was inadvertently excluded from the Baldwin Historic Architecture Survey, F15, was included in this survey (Figure 2b). A second, F16, was included even though its buildings lie outside the boundary of the APE because of their proximity to the APE. Because turbine locations have been somewhat altered since the APE for the Baldwin Project was established, the APE for the western portion of the Wilton IV APE is not an exact match to the Baldwin APE. However, the Wilton IV APE falls within the boundaries of the Baldwin APE; all areas in this part of the Wilton IV APE have been previously surveyed.

The APE is a rural landscape of relatively flat, open fields with vernacular modern and historic houses. Farmsteads and outbuildings are generally set back from the road and are often located behind shelterbelts of trees.

2.0 RESEARCH DESIGN

The research design was created to identify those above ground resources with the APE that were style-dated in the field to as 45 years old or older (a date range requested by Western, the lead Federal Agency) and to locate previously recorded cultural resources to determine if they were still extant. In order to accomplish this Tetra Tech undertook both Class I and Class II investigations.

2.1 SHSND File Search

The Class I file search of archaeological and historic structures records was undertaken on August 26, 2011, by Tetra Tech's archeologist, Adam Holven, MA, at the SHSND in Bismarck. This file review enumerated cultural resources studies on file at SHSND, including previous studies in the Project vicinity and records of inventoried archaeological sites and historic structures, bridges, and cemeteries. The review considered the area within 1 mile of the Wilton IV turbine layout of August 5, 2011, and the roads/collection layout of August 15, 2011. Although minor changes have been made to the Project layout subsequent to August 2011, the changes have not materially affected the area covered by Tetra Tech's file search of that month.

2.2 Previous Architectural Investigations

One architectural investigation, "Baldwin Wind Energy Center: A Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey in Burleigh County, North Dakota" (Sexton 2010), has previously been conducted in the Project area. This reconnaissance survey was conducted within 1 mile of the proposed Baldwin turbine layout in Crofte and Ecklund Townships (Figure 1) and evaluated historic structures estimated to be over 45 years old on the basis of stylistic characteristics and other evidence. Although the prior survey covered the western turbine field of the present Wilton IV APE, it did not include the eastern portion in Ghylin Township and vicinity.

During the Baldwin field survey, 77 historic and recent properties were observed throughout the whole Baldwin APE, including two previously-recorded properties (32BL654 and 32BL655) and 30 new properties that Tetra Tech recorded (Sexton 2010). The inventoried historic properties included 25 farmsteads (five with at least the main house abandoned), three abandoned schools, three individual houses or cabins, and one building of unknown type. SHSND concurred with Tetra Tech's recommendations that none of these properties were potentially eligible to the NRHP and with a finding of No Historic Properties Affected. A total of 11 of the properties noted above are located within the current APE. Table 2 shows all of these properties.

The background research also included a review of historic documentation including General Land Office maps, plat maps, and aerial photographs. Documents covering the Project Area and vicinity were examined to identify any historic structures, railroads, roads, and trails that might be encountered during the field survey. Table 3 identifies historic maps and aerial photos available for Burleigh County.

2.3 Methodology and Field Work

A Class II architectural survey, the goal of which was to identify properties containing buildings style-dated as 45 years old or older, was conducted by Tetra Tech's archeologist, Adam Holven, MA and Tetra Tech's architectural historian, James Sexton, Ph. D. The methods employed were approved by the SHSND. On September 20, 2012, Holven drove all public roads within one mile of the nearest Project element in an area not previously investigated and photographed all resources that were visible from the public right-of-way. Photographs of the properties were taken using a Canon PowerShot SX260 HS. Holven also photographed two properties located in the western section of the APE which had inadvertently been missed during the Baldwin survey. Field notes were taken, a photo log was created, and a 2010 aerial photograph was used to record the property locations. During the fieldwork, resources were given an identification number starting with C for Cemetery and F for Farmsteads.

The collected data were then compared to historic maps to determine whether buildings had been standing in these locations at least 45 years ago. Finally, the photographs and collected data were examined by Sexton to determine the potential NRHP eligibility of the properties and North Dakota Cultural Resources Survey (NDCRS_ Architectural Site Forms were completed for each property determined to contain buildings roughly 45 years ago. (The 1969 plat map was used as the basis for this approximate determination.)

3.0 FINDINGS

Seventeen previously-unrecorded historic and recent properties within the APE were observed. The locations of these properties are shown on Figure 2a. Of these, eleven farmsteads and one cemetery were identified through documentary research using historic plat books as being 45 years old or older. Properties F3, F11, F12, and F14 (farmsteads) and FRS1 (a former radio station) were found to be without buildings on the 1969 plat map. They were therefore considered not to meet the criterion for documentation of being 45 years old or older. All previously unrecorded properties were evaluated to determine if they retained integrity in seven aspects defined by the National Park Service (NPS) that their significance is evident (NPS, 1997). These aspects of integrity are the following:

- Location
- Design
- Setting
- Materials
- Workmanship
- Feeling
- Association

In addition, to be determined eligible for the NRHP, properties must meet at least one of the following NRHP Criteria for Evaluation. To be eligible for listing on the NRHP, properties must be ones:

- A. That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history; or
- B. That are associated with the lives of persons significant in our past; or
- C. That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or
- D. That have yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history. (36CFR60.4)

Based on the data collected in the field, and using the standards described above, Tetra Tech assessed the potential eligibility to the NRHP of each documented property. None of these resources was evaluated as meeting the NRHP criteria of eligibility.

3.1 Properties Previously Recorded within the APE

The file search conducted at the SHSND prior to the commencement of field work identified no sites or site leads within the Project APE for historic architecture that had previously been recorded other than those that were recorded for the Baldwin survey. As this work was completed in 2010, the SHSND agreed that these properties did not need to be resurveyed for this Project. They were excluded from the study area.

3.2 Properties Recorded by Tetra Tech (2012) within the APE

Fieldwork conducted by Tetra Tech on September 20, 2012, identified all above-ground historic properties within the previously unsurveyed portion of the APE (Table 4). In addition, two properties inadvertently omitted from the Baldwin survey are included (F15 and F16). Twelve of these seventeen resources were determined to be historic (i.e. 45 years old or older); these are documented below. The following pages include a resource identification number (starting with C for Cemetery and F for Farmstead), photos of the properties, with multiple photos where the property included more than one architectural feature. The photograph captions include the field code of the resource (matching the SHSND form associated with the resource), its location, the direction of the photograph, the name of the photographer and the date the photograph was taken. Each photograph is followed by a brief description of the resource and a recommendation on its eligibility to the NRHP. The location of each documented property is given in Figure 2b.

Property C1 is the Ghylin Union Cemetery (established 1907), located at Township 142N, Range 78W, Section 20. The property retains integrity of location, design, setting, materials, craftsmanship, and feeling. However, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those interred here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This cemetery is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

F1 is a historic farmstead with a contemporary house located in the southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 14, Township 142N, Range 78W. Buildings have appeared in this location since the Geo. A. Ogle plat map of 1912, which shows “And. Anderson” owning this quarter section as well as the quarter section directly to the south.

The property retains integrity of location, design, setting, and materials. However, the introduction of the contemporary house diminishes the integrity of feeling, and the state of disrepair of many of the outbuildings diminishes the integrity of workmanship. Additionally, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

F2 is a farmstead located in the northeast 1/4 of Section 24, Township 142N, Range 78W. Buildings have been on the property since the Geo. A. Ogle plat map of 1912, at which time the land was owned by Maggie Mills. The current buildings appear to be more recent replacements of earlier buildings.

The property retains integrity of location and setting. The more recent buildings have led to the property losing its integrity of design, materials, workmanship and feeling. In addition, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

F4 is a farmstead located Township 142N, Range 78W, Section 24. The Geo. A. Ogle plat map of 1912 depicts a farmstead with several buildings at this location, but does not identify the owner or occupant. During fieldwork, the two residences on the property were thought to be part of two different farmsteads, and were assigned two different site numbers, F4 and F13. Subsequent research suggests that the two buildings were part of the same farmstead, and so the F13 site number was dropped and the two residences were treated as part of F4.

The property retains integrity of location, design, setting, materials, and feeling. The introduction of modern materials on some of the buildings does not compromise the overall integrity of the site. However, the property is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.



F5 is a farmstead located in the southeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 35, Township 142N, Range 78W. Buildings have been on the property since the Geo. A. Ogle and Company plat map of 1912; at that time the property was owned by Simon Jahr.

The property retains integrity of location, design, setting, and material. Its integrity of feeling is compromised by the introduction of a trailer home and the level of disrepair. It is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

Additionally, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.



Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

F15 is a farmstead located in the southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 142N, Range 70W. Unlike the properties C1 and F1 to F14, it is situated in the southwestern section of the Wilton IV Project. Most of that section of the Project was originally surveyed for the Baldwin project (Sexton 2010), but this property was inadvertently not included in that survey. The property was owned by Jos. Sorch at the time of the 1912 Geo. A. Ogle plat map. Buildings are also depicted at this location in later maps.

The property retains integrity of location, setting, and materials. However, the lack of a residence on the property indicates that it has lost integrity of design and feeling. In addition, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This property is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

F16 is a farmstead located in the northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Township 141N, Range 79W. Unlike the properties C1 and F1 to F14, it is situated in the southwestern section of the Wilton IV Project. Most of that section of the Project was originally surveyed for the Baldwin project (Sexton 2010). While this property lies outside the boundary of the APE its proximity to the APE has led to its inclusion in this survey. The property was owned by A.A. Carlson at the time of the 1912 Geo. A. Ogle plat map. Buildings were depicted at this location in all subsequent maps.

The property is blocked from view by a shelter belt; elements of the property are barely visible from the public right-of-way. The portion that is visible retains integrity of location and setting. Changes to the visible buildings affect the integrity of materials, design, workmanship and feeling. In addition, it is not known to be associated with any historic events important to local, state or national history (Criterion A), does not have significant or unusual architecture (Criterion C), nor is it thought to have significant potential to yield historical information (Criterion D). Further research may yield information about those who lived here; at this time no association with a significant historical figure is known (Criterion B). This farmstead is recommended by Tetra Tech as not eligible to the NRHP.

4.0 CONCLUSIONS

The Project consists of two distinct turbine fields 6 to 11 miles apart occupying adjoining ridges but separated from one another by the West Branch of Apple Creek. The southwestern turbine field will occupy a portion of Crofte Township, while the northeastern field will be in Ghylin Township (Figure 1). In consultation with the SHSND, the APE has been defined as the area located within one mile of any turbine. The western portion of the APE was previously surveyed for the Baldwin Wind Energy Center (Sexton 2010); SHSND concurred with the recommendation of the report that a finding *No historic Properties Affected* was appropriate. The SHSND also agreed that, since the Baldwin survey was recently undertaken, the survey area for the present study comprised only those areas not previously surveyed. Two properties from the western part of the APE were included in this survey as they were inadvertently omitted from the earlier survey.

A Class I File Search and Class II Reconnaissance Survey were undertaken to identify those properties within one mile of the proposed Project within Ghylin township that might be historic (i.e. 45 years old or older). The files search located one manuscript and associated site forms for resources located within one mile of the nearest project element. During field work for the Reconnaissance Survey, 17 properties were observed; documentary research showed that only 12 of these were 45 years old or older. These sites included eleven farmsteads and one cemetery. Although historic, Tetra Tech recommends that none of these are potentially eligible to the NRHP. Consequently, provided that the Project is constructed as described herein, a finding of *No Historic Properties Affected* is recommended.







Figure 1:



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



On July 28, 2011, the Western Area Power Administration (Western) received a letter from the State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) indicating the agency's preliminary review of the Wilton IV Wind Energy Center (ND SHPO REF: 11-2157 WAPA). In this letter, SHSND recommended the completion of a Class I Cultural Resources Inventory, Class II Reconnaissance Survey for standing structures, and a Class III Pedestrian Survey for areas to be directly impacted by the project. To date, Tetra Tech has completed the Class I Cultural Resources Inventory and the Class III Pedestrian Survey.

Tetra Tech has also conducted an architectural reconnaissance survey, *Baldwin Wind Energy Center: A Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey in Burleigh County, North Dakota* (ND SHPO REF: 09-1801 WAPA) that included evaluating structure 45 years and older located within 1 mile of the 37 alternate turbines in Crofte Township. These turbines were not constructed as part of the Baldwin Wind Energy Center and are currently proposed to be constructed as part of the Wilton IV Wind Energy Center. The project layout includes 35 turbines and one alternative turbine site located in Crofte Township. Of these, 29 turbines coincide with the turbine locations previously evaluated as Baldwin alternates.

During the field survey conducted for the Baldwin Wind Energy Center, 77 properties were observed. Of these 77 properties, two were previously recorded (32BL654 [a historic school] and 32BL655 [a farmstead]) and 30 were identified as meeting the age requirements to be considered historic and were recorded by Tetra Tech (Sexton 2010). These historic properties included 25 farmsteads, 3 abandoned schools, 3 individual houses or cabins, and 1 building of unknown type. Tetra Tech recommended that none of these properties were potentially eligible to the National Register and a finding of No Historic Properties Affected was proposed.

Based on the previous work that has been conducted within the Project area, Tetra Tech requests the SHPO's comments on the size of the area of potential effects (APE) for visual effects for the Wilton IV Wind Energy Center. Tetra Tech has provided a map (hard copy and electronic copy) of the proposed turbine layout dated September 21, 2011, the proposed Wilton IV APE for

Historic Architecture, and the areas previous surveyed during the Baldwin Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey.

Tetra Tech proposes that a 1-mile search area be applied to the proposed turbine locations in Ghylin Township. Although some turbine locations within the Wilton IV turbine layout have been modified from the Baldwin survey conducted in Crofte Township, these modifications are within areas previously surveyed during the Baldwin Class II Architectural Reconnaissance Survey (see the provided map). Therefore, Tetra Tech not does recommend additional surveying activities in Crofte Township.

Tetra Tech understands that the SHSND and Western are both considering how the proposed Project may affect architectural resources in the project area and may need to consult to determine an appropriate APE for visual effects. 
