**SUBJECT:** Initial Notice of Public Scoping for an Environmental Assessment, Identification of Historic Properties and Notice of Floodplain and Wetland Action for the Vidal Solar Interconnection Project

Dear Interested Party,

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA, 40 CFR Parts 1500-1508) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA, 36 CFR Part 800), Western Area Power Administration (WAPA) invites your participation in establishing the scope of environmental issues and studies associated with the Vidal Solar Interconnection Project (Vidal Solar) located near Vidal, San Bernardino County, California.

**Proposed Action**

WAPA is a Federal power-marketing agency within the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) that operates and maintains transmission lines and associated facilities in accordance with Section 211 of the Federal Power Act and its Open Access Transmission Service Tariff (OATT). WAPA is responding to a request from CDH Vidal LLC to interconnect their proposed Vidal Solar photovoltaic solar facility and battery energy storage system (BESS) facility to WAPA's nearby electrical transmission system (*see enclosed map*).

WAPA's OATT requires it to evaluate interconnection requests based on available transmission capacity, the safety and reliability of the bulk electrical system, and the results of environmental planning processes. WAPA lacks authority over the location of the requester's electrical generation facility and the methods and equipment used at that facility.

CDH Vidal LLC proposes to build, operate, and maintain an approximately 160-megawatt (MW) photovoltaic solar energy generation facility and a 160 MW BESS facility on a 1,220-acre parcel of private land (project area/area of potential effects [APE]). Construction of the facility would include solar panels, access roads, an underground electrical collection system and connection to an on-site collection point substation. Vidal Solar's facilities are not part of WAPA's Federal action, but their potential indirect impacts/effects will be presented alongside that of the Federal action as part of a comprehensive analysis in a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA).

WAPA anticipates that construction could begin as soon as the second quarter of 2022. This start date depends on the completion of planning efforts described below and assumes that no

significant environmental impacts are identified. Further information about the proposed project is available online at:

## Environmental Planning Processes

WAPA is preparing an EA to evaluate the environmental effects of the Vidal Solar based on the provisions in 10 CFR 1021 of the Department of Energy NEPA Implementing Procedures since this proposed project includes the interconnection of new generation that is less than 50 average megawatts.

Receiving this Notice of Public Scoping letter is the first step in the environmental review process. The additional steps of WAPA's environmental review process are reflected below:

WAPA proposes to address the following planning requirements and seeks your input:

- **Clean Water Act & Executive Order 11988 Floodplain Management:** WAPA will assess the proposed action's impacts, if any, to waters of the U.S., floodplains, and wetlands, and comply with the requirements of applicable U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Section 404 permits. CDH Vidal LLC will apply for permits related to their facilities. We seek your input about floodplains located near the project area and ways to avoid or minimize impacts.
- **Endangered Species Act:** WAPA will serve as lead Federal agency and will evaluate threatened, endangered and other special status species and their habitat that could be affected by the proposed action and will consult with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as needed. WAPA will conduct a biological review of areas impacted. WAPA seeks your observations about the occurrence of protected species near the project area and suggestions on ways to avoid or minimize adverse effects.
- **NEPA:** WAPA will serve as lead Federal agency in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment (EA) of the proposed action and its impacts. WAPA seeks your comments about alternatives and environmental issues that you would like to see presented in a Draft Environmental Assessment.
- **NHPA:** WAPA will serve as the lead Federal agency for Section 106 of the NHPA. WAPA seeks your suggestions about available sources of cultural resource information

and applicable types of identification efforts. As WAPA plans to conduct a cultural resources field survey of the project area/APE it also seeks your input about the presence of historic properties or places of religious, traditional and cultural importance that may be impacted or affected by the proposed action.

### **Get Involved**

WAPA would like to know of any environmental issues, concerns, and suggestions you may have regarding the proposed action, project area or APE. Your comments will help define issues and alternatives for consideration in the environmental review processes mentioned above. Please submit your scoping comments by February 17, 2022 (post-mark by this date.) WAPA will consider late comments to the extent practicable.

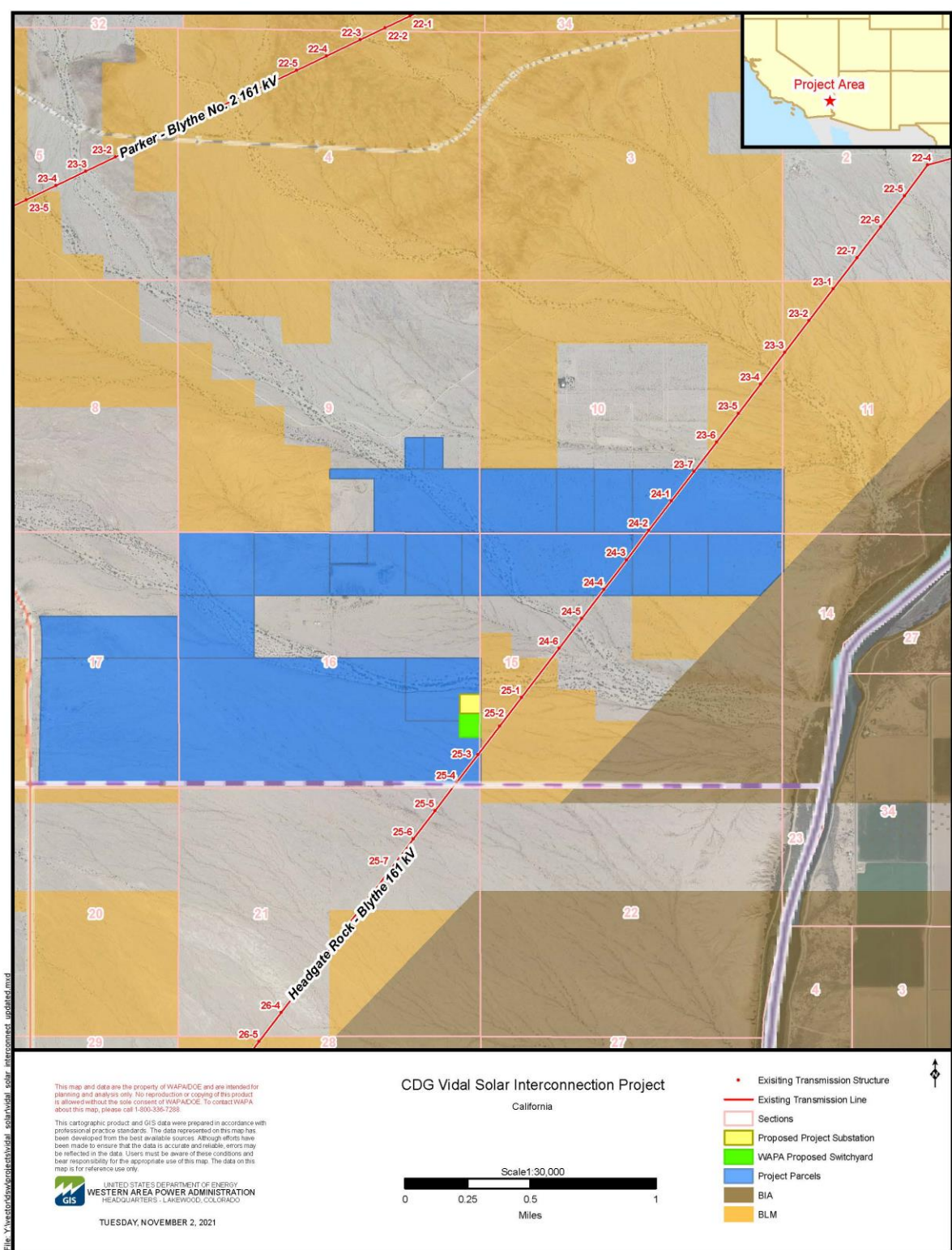
### **Next Steps**
