Western Area Power Administration is a federal agency under the Department of Energy that markets and delivers reliable, hydroelectric power and transmission services.

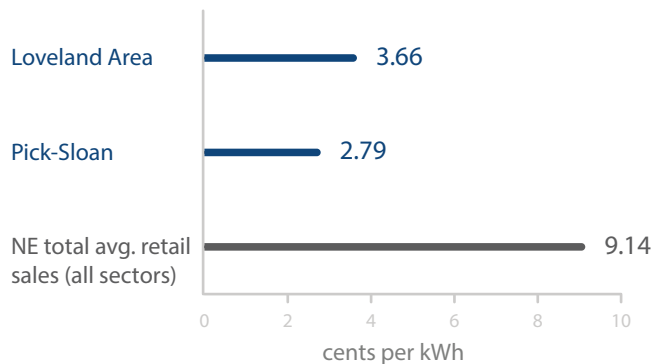
