WAPA serves Nevada

Western Area Power Administration is a federal agency under the Department of Energy that markets and delivers reliable, hydroelectric power and transmission services.

WAPA manages a 15-state, high-voltage transmission network serving more than 680 utility customers – municipalities, public power cooperatives and state and federal agencies, among others – which in turn provide power to 40 million Americans.

WAPA keeps the lights on for communities across the West and Great Plains. Our work ensures affordable energy reaches millions of people while supporting grid reliability and national security.

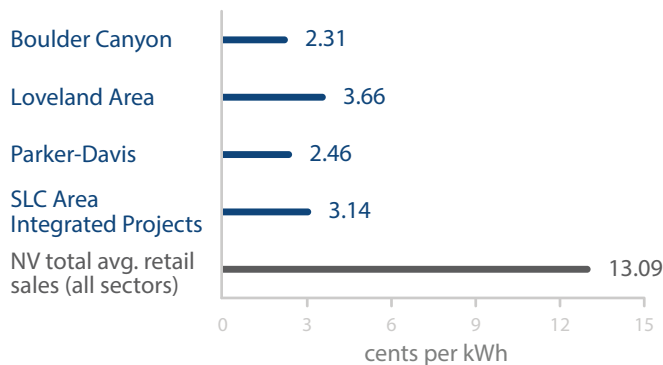

PROJECTS PROVIDING POWER IN NV

Boulder Canyon Project

WAPA's Desert Southwest region markets and transmits Boulder Canyon Project power. Power from BCP is marketed as long-term contingent capacity with associated firm energy.

Loveland Area Projects

The Loveland Area Projects include the Fryingpan-Arkansas Project and the Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program—Western Division for marketing and rate-setting purposes.

Parker-Davis Project

The Parker-Davis Project is currently marketed to 35 customers in southern Nevada, Arizona and Southern California, and supplies electricity to more than 300,000 people.

Salt Lake City Area/Integrated Projects

Power generated at the Colorado River Storage Project and from the Collbran and Rio Grande projects was combined into the Salt Lake City Area/Integrated Projects in 1987.
