WAPA serves Utah

Western Area Power Administration is a federal agency under the Department of Energy that markets and delivers reliable, hydroelectric power and transmission services.

WAPA manages a 15-state, high-voltage transmission network serving more than 680 utility customers – municipalities, public power cooperatives and state and federal agencies, among others – which in turn provide power to 40 million Americans.

WAPA keeps the lights on for communities across the West and Great Plains. Our work ensures affordable energy reaches millions of people while supporting grid reliability and national security.

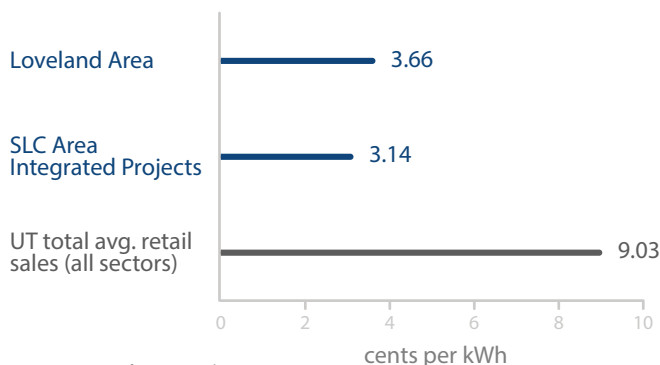

PROJECTS PROVIDING POWER IN UT

Loveland Area Projects

The Loveland Area Projects include the Fryingpan-Arkansas Project and the Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program—Western Division for marketing and rate-setting purposes.

Olmsted Project

Since 2018, WAPA has marketed Olmsted Project power. Customers purchase all power generation from the project and make annual payments.

Provo River Project

Provo River Project power is marketed by WAPA to Utah Municipal Power Agency, Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems and Heber Light and Power.

Salt Lake City Area/Integrated Projects

Power generated at the Colorado River Storage Project and from the Collbran and Rio Grande projects was combined into the Salt Lake City Area/Integrated Projects in 1987.
